The NAV was up 0.7% and the FTSE All Share (incl. dividends) was up 1.3% for the month.

July has been a quiet month with very little significant activity to report.

News of note included good interim results from both GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) and Vesuvius. GSK saw growth across all three of their divisions and announced a cost saving programme which will fund additional Research & Development. Vesuvius reported on favourable conditions for all geographies within which they operate.

easyJet reported positive underlying results but highlighted the negative effects of the continued French air traffic control strikes. Sports Direct reported underlying numbers at the higher end of expectations and outlined that their plan to elevate the product offering was continuing and exceeding expectations in new stores.

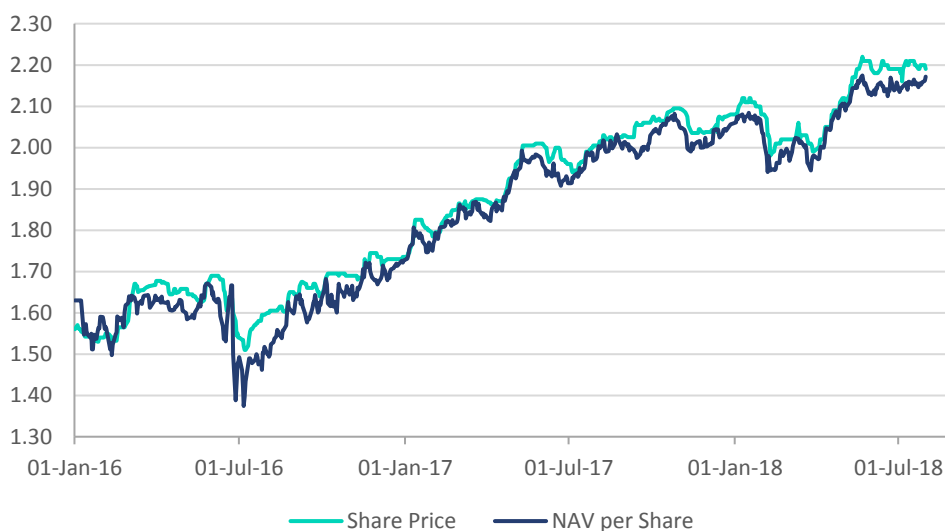

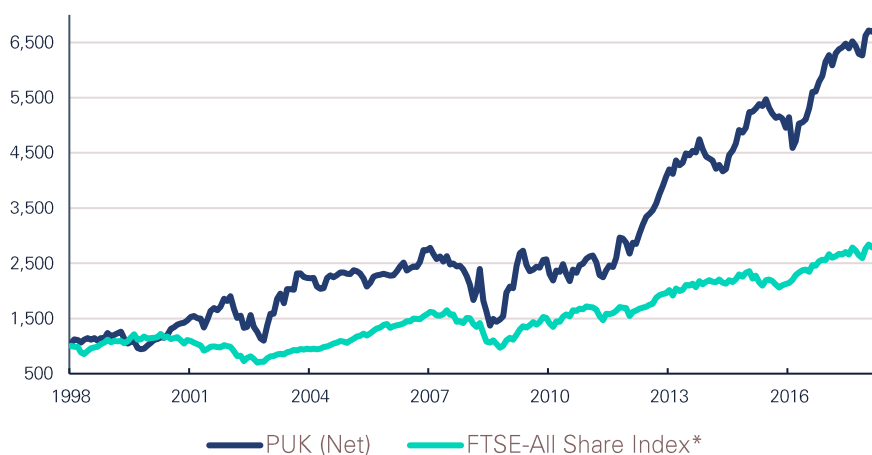
